A few notes on the service: this leaflet and the blue hymnal in the pews guide the worship. The bolded text is said by the congregation, and the hymns are sung by all. The priest will give further instructions. If you're unsure about something, ask one of the sidespeople or a neighbour—they'd be glad to help. After most services we share refreshments and coffee in the parish hall. Please come! If you're not able to stay the clergy would be glad to greet you at the door.

Our worship centres on the celebration of Holy Eucharist. All baptized Christians from any tradition or denomination are welcome to receive the sacrament. Glutenfree wafers are available on request. Everyone is welcome to receive a blessing instead of the bread and the wine. To indicate this, please place your arms across your chest.

Jesus was known for welcoming children. At Grace we try to follow his example. Children are always welcome to stay in the service, and the colouring corner is available every Sunday. "Children's Church" for children age three and up is on the second floor. Nursery care for younger children is there too.

THE NICENE CREED*

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER*

We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen**

Christmas Services | Christmas Eve is this Tuesday! Join us at 4 pm (Family Service), 7 pm (Choral Eucharist), or 10 pm ('Midnight Mass'). Note that on December 25th and 29th the 10 am Holy Eucharist will be the only morning service. Those who usually attend the 8 am service are invited to join at 10 am. Children's church is on hiatus until January. Nursery care will not be offered on the December 25th morning service. The office will be closed from December 24th at noon until December 27th inclusively, and will reopen on December 30th.

It currently serves over 1500 households per month with each person per household being provided with 3 days of food. 2024 Year End Giving Reminder:

As year-end approaches we take this time to inform you about how to deliver your year-end donations to Grace Church on-the-Hill in time for a 2024 tax receipt. Your donation to Grace Church on-the-Hill creates a non-refundable charitable tax credit, which is a reduction in the taxes you will owe to the Canadian federal and provincial governments. Here's how to give:

In Person:

You may donate during upcoming Worship Services in December, including the 24th, 25th and 29th. Check our website for times of services. You may also deliver your donation in person to the Church office, which is open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 pm daily, Monday to Friday, until December 24th. The office will be closed from **December 24 at 12pm to December 27 inclusive** and will reopen on Monday December 30th.

By Mail

Given the current mail strike, please bring your completed pledge to the church. Hopefully the strike will be over soon. Once this happens you can mail your cheque to the Church up until year end, so long as the cheque is dated for 2024 and has a postmark dated 31 December 2024 or earlier.

Gifts of Listed Securities:

If you are considering a gift of listed securities to the Church, keep in mind that the last market trading day of 2024 is December 30th. Leaving it this late does not guarantee it can be processed by the end of the year. Charitable donations between different brokerages can take between (2-3) business days and could be extended in December due to volume and staffing. We recommend you have your requests submitted by Mid-December to ensure your contribution is processed by the end of the year.
